Bob Brown has had a l ife long involvement in entertainment, both in the spot light and behind it. Bob has done photography, theater, events, construction, some broadcasting and local government. And two of the very best daughters a parent can have. A full glass that remains so. Doesn't get any better.

Peter Cleaveland began his broadcasting career in 1961 atKNBC (KNBR) doing traffic reports and background for Doug Pledger and Dick Stewart. He became a reporter and ABC network correspondent at KGO Radio, leading to a 19 year career with KGO and ABC. Pete then served on the national board of the broadcast union, AFTRA. From 1986 until his retirement in 2002 he was on AFTRA's national staff. President of the *Broadcast Legends* & member of The Bay Area Radio Hall of Fame, class of 2017.



Carolyn Compton is a stage actor performing in bay area theatres. most recently in *The Crucible* at Costal Repertory. He also worked as a fill-in disc-jockey at KKAL-AM in Arroyo Grande. He returned to the Bay Area in 1987 to work at KQED-FM. He now hosts morning drive forKQED & KQEI radio, and is the staff announcer for KQED TV.



Tyce Fields is a veteran community theater actor and singer performing throughout the Bay Area. Musical Theater: Memorable roles include George in Kinky Boots and Monsignor O'Hara in Sister Act with Redwood City Community Theater; Levi in Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat and Judas in Godspell with First Pres Players in Burlingame; and most recently Dr. Norquist in Bright Star with TMC Arts in Castro Valley. Live Music: When he's not in a musical Tyce is a singer at BurlPres for both the Sunday Worship Band and the Men's Fellowship Band in Burlingame. Radio: Preparing for the role has taken him back in time when he worked on college radio at Washington & Lee University - WLUR in Lexington, VA - where he first learned to work behind a microphone and do commercial radio spots for local businesses in the Shenandoah Valley.
